## 2022 U13 Hurling League/Tournament Rules

Length: Juvenile Goals on 13 m line
7-a-side Pitch $=$
Width: $\quad$ Adult Width (80m (min) - 90m (max))

Length: $\quad 60 \mathrm{~m}(\min )-90 \mathrm{~m}$ (max)
Width: $\quad 40 \mathrm{~m}(\mathrm{~min})-52 \mathrm{~m}$ (max)
All games played at 11 -a-side or 12-a-side or 13-a-side shall be played on the Reduced Pitch. All games played at $\mathbf{1 0 - a}$-side or less shall be played on the $\mathbf{7 - a - s i d e ~ P i t c h . ~}$

## Number of Players:

1. All games to be played to maximum of 13-a-side and all members of the team panel are to participate in the game. Games can be played at a minimum 9-a-side.
2. Any game played at $\mathbf{1 4}$ or $\mathbf{1 5}$-a-side and/or on a Full Adult Pitch will be deemed null and void.
3. Teams with less than 9 players will play the game at the numbers they have but will forfeit the game.
4. A team(s) that does not field correctly as per rules may be fined $€ 200$ minimum and may be disqualified from the competition.
5. Games are to be played at the highest number available for selection. If 13 eligible players are present, then clubs are to play 13 players. If a player receives a genuine injury, clubs are to reduce their playing numbers to match. Clubs are not to reduce numbers for disciplinary reasons i.e. Red cards.

## Rules

1. The duration of the game will be $\mathbf{4}$ quarters of $\mathbf{1 5}$ minutes ( $\mathbf{6 0} \mathbf{~ m i n s )}$ ).

There will be a one-minute interval after the first quarter for water and to make substitutions.
An interval, not exceeding ten minutes, shall be allowed at half-time, following which the teams shall change ends.

There will be another one-minute interval after the third quarter for water and to make substitutions.
2. SILENT SIDELINES are enforced.
3. If extra time is necessary, 5 minutes per half will be played.

If still level after extra time, a best of 5 penalty-taking competition will decide the winner.
All knockout games must have a Winner on the Day.
4. All games will be played as fixed by Coiste na nÓg. No requested changes will be considered unless there are exceptional circumstances. All games will be played as fixed, or a club(s) will concede the fixture. Any club(s) that does not fulfil a fixture will be dealt with as per the Official Guide.
5. Size 4 sliotars must be used.

A team(s) using any incorrect equipment will be fined $€ 50$ for each game that incorrect equipment is used.
6. Pitches must be flagged and marked appropriately.
7. There shall be no penalty pucks or square ball.
8. Flags are needed at $13 \mathrm{~m}, 20 \mathrm{~m}, 45 \mathrm{~m}, \&$ halfway lines on Reduced pitch.
9. Coiste na nÓg will appoint all referees.
10. A club fielding a second team in this competition must name their top 13 players.

A club fielding a third team must name their next top 13 players that are eligible to play for the second team. These top 26 players cannot play on the third team.
Failure to abide by this will mean that all games will be awarded to opposition, the club may be fined $€ 200$ minimum and the persons involved will be sanctioned in accordance with the Official Guide.
11. Players should not play with two teams on the same day.
12. All members of the team panel should participate in the game.

Coiste na nÓg recommends that all players play at least two quarters of the game.
All clubs should be encouraged to promote an equal playing time ethos where younger players are not playing above their grade unless necessary due to a lack of numbers within a catchment area.
13. Substitutions shall be unlimited. All substitutions must be made in a break of play.

A break in play shall be when the play is stopped after a score or wide or for a free, sideline kick/kick or when the Referee has stopped play for medical attention to an injured player.
Teams must use the official team list supplied by Coiste na nÓg. No need for sub slips.
All players must have their unique GAA registration number on this form.
All players are to be on the team list.
This list must be presented to the referee in Irish, in BLOCK CAPITALS, and in duplicate before the commencement of the game(s).
14. Where a club fails to observe the rule that all members of the team panel should participate in the game; that club shall forfeit the match and may be disqualified from the competition.
15. Where both clubs in the same match fail to observe the rule that all members of the team panel should participate in the game; the game shall be deemed void and both clubs may be disqualified from the competitions.
16. In all instances where the referee moves the ball forward, the ball shall be moved $\mathbf{3 0 \mathrm { m }}$ not $\mathbf{1 3 m}$.
17. Normal scoring applies. A goal equals 3 points and a point equals 1 singular point.
18. The goalkeeper may advance $\mathbf{1 3} \mathbf{m}$ for a puck out.
19. The shoulder-to-shoulder charge is permitted.
20. The ball may be carried for a maximum four consecutive steps or held in the hand(s) for no longer, than the time needed to take four steps.
21. Free pucks may be taken from the ground or lifted and struck.
22. The player who is fouled MUST take the free puck. (Aggressive fouls by the opponent only)
23. When the ball is played over the endline and outside the goalposts by the team defending that end, a free puck shall be awarded to the opposing team 65 m from the endline opposite where the ball crossed the endline.
24. Opposing players must be at least 20 m from the player taking a free puck or puck out.
25. Opposing players must be at least 13 m from the player taking a sideline puck.

26 . Free pucks cannot be taken closer than 20 m from the opposing end line.

All mentors must wear a distinctive coloured bib. If a person is not wearing a bib, then they will not be considered a mentor by the referee.
Failure for mentors to wear distinctive coloured bibs will mean they will not be allowed inside the playing enclosure.
Only Team Officials can enter the pitch enclosure to a maximum of 5. This includes all team management, medical personnel, and the Club Secretary/Chairperson.
All Team Officials must be 18 years old. Clubs must ensure that this is implemented.
No mentor can be on the pitch. Only medical personnel or one designated person can enter the pitch area when permitted by the referee. SILENT SIDELINES are enforced.
A club that does not adhere to Rule 27 listed above may be fined $\boldsymbol{€} \mathbf{2 0 0}$ minimum per game and mentors will be dealt by Rule 7.2 of the Official Guide.

## Any mentor that continually encroaches on the field will not be allowed to be on the sideline for the remainder of the U12/U13 Hurling/Football Competitions.

28. The travel expenses for all certified Referees shall be as follows:

## U13-€20 per team per game

29. Referees' expenses shall be split between teams playing on the day.

Each club is responsible for paying the Referee directly before the game starts.
A team's official team list must be presented to Referee at least 5 mins before the throw in alongside the Referees' expenses.
30. Any team that refusing to pay Referees' expenses/or does not present their team list correctly will be fined minimum $€ 200$. The club must also pay the travel expenses that were initially not paid.
31. If no neutral official referee present, visiting team has choice of an official referee.
32. If no official referee present, then the visiting team has choice of an accredited Award 1 Coach who will referee the game.
33. If no official referee/Award 1 Coach present, then game is not to be played under any circumstance.
34. Check opponent's colours in case of clash, home team must change.

If in a neutral venue, then both teams change.
35. Detailed Regulations governing the organisation and presentation of all Inter-Club Games at U13 level in Meath GAA will be sent to clubs.

These must be followed in all games.
There will be an emphasis on these at finals and they must be strictly adhered to and they will be monitored by Coiste na nÓg.
Coiste na nÓg an Mhí is mindful of the GAA Give Respect Get Respect campaign and has drawn up these Regulations for the benefit of all stakeholders - players, referees, team management, officials, media, members and spectators.
